Dear Rebel Community,

As we continue to tell the story of Running Rebels Community Organization, we'll remember 2022 as a year of re-connection and re-orientation, much welcomed after a long period of isolation and rapid, unpredictable change. Rebel youth, families, and staff were finally able to come together again and be present with each other in a real way.

Our work has always been about <u>keeping young people connected</u>. We believe that consistent access to a caring and compassionate adult mentor is the most important connection we can provide to a young person. All youth need and deserve these relationships.

Across all Rebel programs offered in 2022, our professional adult mentors connected with over 2,500 Milwaukee youth.



Alongside a quality relationship with an adult mentor, what other connections are necessary for youth to thrive? This answer is different for each young person.

In 2022, we connected Rebel youth to educational support, social-emotional learning and leadership development opportunities, workforce training, and entrepreneurship education. We connected them with resources to explore the arts, celebrate Black history & culture, improve their personal health, and engage in sports & recreation. We created opportunities for our young people to connect with themselves, each other, their community, and a sense of hope.

Our Best Moments of 2022



Youth Employment

In our summer employment program, we hired over 43 Rebel youth, who held various positions across our East and Central facilities and engaged in workforce development training.



Garden Growth

Alongside staff and with the essential help of our community partners, Rebel youth received a hands-on gardening education. Each youth had a chance to plan and care for their own plot over the course of this Running Rebels program.



Black Excellence

In 2022 we helped launch the first annual Unity Black Excellence Awards to honor the achievements of Milwaukee's Black community, including excellence in youth services, sports, politics, entertainment, and activism.



Celebrating Unity

2022's EPIC Evening fundraiser was a celebration of unity and represented the first time the Rebel community had gathered all together in person since 2019. That night we raised over \$242,941 for Milwaukee youth.



Marching for Unity

Rebel youth and staff marched in the first annual Unity March & Rally, a movement to improve the community's quality of life, create equitable opportunities for Black people, and strengthen the Black community.



Holiday Giving

During 2022's holiday season, we gave away over 400 gifts to Rebel youth and community families.



Artful Expressions

147 individual youth engaged in our UNITY Arts program and had opportunities to explore a variety of visual, performing, and digital art forms. Rebel youth Jerri says, "I was in depression, I was suicidal, and spoken word got me up out of it and taught me how to express my emotions better, taught me how to communicate."



College Scholarships

As part of our Higher Education & Learning Program (H.E.L.P), we gave away more than \$13,000 in post-secondary scholarships to 10 college-bound youth.

Lay Lay, age 10, is mentored by Kristina through our Community Mentoring Program.


"I was happy when I found out Kristina was my mentor, that I had someone I felt comfortable talking to. She helped me get out of my shy phase, got me to talk to people, helped me in the tutoring room, helped me become a better person in life. She makes me smile, gets the bad things off my mind, and helps me try new things. Everyone thinks as a mentor you just have to be straight up nice – she is kind, but she tells you when you're doing something wrong too. Last year I sang [at the 2022 Unity Gala], and I was so nervous. She assured me it would be fine, and I felt more confident because I knew she was proud of me."



AJ, age 15, is mentored by RB Vic through our Community Mentoring Program.

"RB has been my mentor for about a year, but I've known him since I was little ... I've always looked up to him. He's where I get my inspiration to do my music. I've watched him do his own music since he was very young. When we're in the studio together, he gives me tips. He's still doing his music, he's in college, has two jobs ... and he still puts in the time to check in on me. RB is where I get my inspiration."
